Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to manganese chloride. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is manganese chloride found?

Manganese chloride is used in oral agents for an MRI of the abdomen and/or pelvis. It is also used in magnetic resonance imaging of animals.

How can you avoid contact with manganese chloride?
