## **Patient Information**

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to amcinonide. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

### Where is amcinonide found?

Amcinonide is found in medications used to treat inflammation and itching of the skin. It reduces swelling, itching, and redness.

## How can you avoid contact with amcinonide?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:
