### Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to ethylmethacrylate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

### Where is ethylmethacrylate found?

This substance is found in adhesives, dental products, textiles, leather, paper, and is used in oil additives.
