Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to sorbitan sesquioleate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching and fluid-filled blisters.

Sorbitan sesquioleate is an additive found in food, veterinary products, and household items.
