Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to benzyl salicylate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is benzyl salicylate found?

Benzyl salicylate is a chemical compound most frequently used in cosmetics. It is also used as a solvent for synthetic musks and as a preservative in floral compositions such as Jasmine, Liliac, and Lily.

How can you avoid contact with benzyl salicylate?
