#### Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to clobetasol-17-propionate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance, although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

#### Where is clobetasol-17-propionate found?

Clobetasol-17-propionate is a topical corticosteroid in ointments and emollient creams. It is sold worldwide under numerous names, including Temovate® (U.S.), Tenovate®, Dermovate®, Dermatovate®, Butavate®, and Movate®. It is used to treat eczema, psoriasis, and seborrhea.

#### How can you avoid contact with clobetasol-17-propionate?

Avoid products that list the following in the ingredients:
