Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to dexamethasone-21phospate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is dexamethasone-21-phosphate found?

This substance is found in anti-inflammatories. It stimulates glutamine uptake in the cerebral cortex.

How can you avoid contact with dexamethasone-21-phosphate?
