Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to benzylbenzoate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is benzylbenzoate found?

Benzylbenzoate is used in fragrances, in foods as a food additive in artificial flavors, as a medical treatment for horses, and as an antiparasitic insecticide.

How can you avoid contact with benzylbenzoate?
