Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to Naproxen. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is Naproxen found?

Naproxen is non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) used to relieve symptoms of arthritis (osteoarthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, or juvenile arthritis) such as inflammation, swelling, stiffness, and joint pain.

How can you avoid contact with Naproxen?

Avoid products that list the following in the ingredients:

- Naproxen
- 2-Naphthaleneacetic acid, 6-methoxy-alpha-methyl-, (+)- (8CI)
- 2-Naphthaleneacetic acid, 6-methoxy-alpha-methyl-, (S)-
- Propionic acid, 2-(6-methoxy-2-naphthyl)-, (+)-
