Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to nystatin. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is nystatin found?

Nystatin is a drug used for treating oral and gastrointestinal fungal infections.

How can you avoid contact with nystatin?
