MS992: Piroxicam

Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a photocontact allergy to piroxicam. This photocontact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is piroxicam found?

Piroxicam is a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) used for pain relief. It is available in medicines for systemic application.

How can you avoid contact with piroxicam?

Avoid products that list the following in the ingredients:

- (8E)-8-[hydroxy-(pyridin-2-ylamino)methylidene]-9-methyl-10,10-dioxo-10λ6-thia-9-azabicyclo[4.4.0]deca-1,3,5-trien-7-one (IUPAC name)
