

FA200: Sodium nitrate

Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to sodium nitrate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is sodium nitrate found?

Sodium nitrate is used as an ingredient in fertilizers, pyrotechnics, as a food preservative, as well as in glass and pottery enamels.

How can you avoid contact with sodium nitrate?
