# **Patient Information**

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to bisphenol F. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

### Where is bisphenol F found?

Bisphenol F is an epoxy resin found in varnishes and enamels. It is also found in furniture finishes, printing inks, dental, surgical, and prosthetic applications.

### How can you avoid contact with bisphenol F?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:

- 2,2'-Methylenebis(phenol)
- 2,2'-Methylenediphenol
- Bis(2-hydroxyphenyl)methane
- Bisphenol F
