Where is this allergen found?

Fragrance mix contains the following eight substances: Geraniol, Cinnamaldehyde, Hydroxycitronnellal, Cinnamyl alcohol, α -Amylcinnamaldehyde, Isoeugenol, Eugenol, and Oak moss. Fragrances can be found in most products. They are used to add flavor or scent to a product or may mask a product's unpleasant smell. They may come from natural (animals or plants) or synthetic sources.

How can you avoid contact with this allergen?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:
