Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to Ibuprofen. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is Ibuprofen found?

Ibuprofen is a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory agent with analgesic properties used in the therapy of rheumatism and arthritis.

How can you avoid contact with Ibuprofen?

Avoid products that list the following in the ingredients:

- Ibuprofen
- Benzeneacetic acid, alpha-methyl-4-(2-methylpropyl)-
- Hydratropic acid, p-isobutyl-
