Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to phenylephrinhydrochlorid. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is phenylephrinhydrochlorid found?

This substance is found in products used as a decongestant, an agent to dilate pupils and increase blood pressure.

How can you avoid contact with phenylephrinhydrochlorid?
