Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to chromium (II) sulphate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is chromium (II) sulphate found?

This substance is often used to manufacture leather products, paints, cement, mortar, and anti-corrosives.

How can you avoid contact with chromium (II) sulphate?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:

- Chromium sulfate (CrSO₄)
- Chromous sulfate

What are some products that may contain chromium (II) sulphate?

Cement

Leather
