### Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to ammonium persulphate. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching and fluid-filled blisters.

### Where is ammonium persulphate found?

Ammonium persulphate is an oxidizing agent and is used in cleaners for laboratory glassware. It is also used as an oxidating agent for vat dyes and in the bleaching and discoloring of oil.

### How can you avoid contact with ammonium persulphate?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:
