Where is this allergen found?

Lauryl glycoside is used in personal care products like shampoos, hand soaps, deodorants, moist toilet wipes, and baby wipes. It is also used in laundry and dish liquids and in all purpose household cleaners.

How can you avoid contact with this allergen?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:

- Lauryl glycoside
- Lauryl glucoside
- D-glucose homopolymer, dodecylether
- D-glucopyranose, oligomeric, C10-16-alkyl glycosides
- Dodecyl glucoside

What are some products that may contain this allergen?

Personal care

- Hand soap (liquid)
- Shaving gels
- Baby wipes
- Shampoos
- Deodorants
- Toilet wipes

Inside the home

- Dish liquids
- Laundry liquids
- All-purpose cleaners
